### Description of Merit

#### Contributions to Profession:

From the programming side of KIIIX-AM in Fort Collins, to the launch of KTCL and his subsequent segue to the business side of radio, to moving with the station to Denver in the 90's, and then ultimately returning to Fort Collins as a Market Manager, Stu was the prime example of tremendous leadership not only inside the building but in the community the stations have served. He became a pillar of the Northern Colorado community, educating businesses about the power of radio and the growth of the Northern Colorado media market.

#### Broadcast Career Highlights:

Over 40 years in radio broadcasting. Among his many CBA Awards, including multiple Station of the Year awards, Stu's most lasting contributions were his visionary roles in developing KTCL 93.3 FM into the modern rock and alternative format that remains a market staple today. He also helped launch Colorado giants 96.1 KISS FM, Big 97.9, and 107.9 The Bear, some of Northern Colorado's most popular stations. These format innovations didn't just build ratings - they shaped the listening identity of an entire region.

#### Broadcast Recognition & Awards:

Rex Howell Award at the 2018 Colorado Broadcaster Association Awards of Excellence. GM for seven Major Market Radio Station of the Year Awards for KSME. Also, after his passing, the iHeart Northern Colorado studios were re-named the "Hashell Studios."

#### Local, State, or National Broadcast Activities:

Stu was involved in many local, state, and national broadcast activities. He oversaw markets in other states for iHeart as a Regional President, as well as Area President overseeing all markets from Cheyenne to Pueblo.

#### Community Service:

Stu sat on many local boards, including a decade-plus run with the local Northern Colorado Boys & Girls Clubs. He also championed and led many charities for local non-profits in Northern Colorado, including KISSMAS Wishes, the BIG Christmas, the 10,000 Can Crusade, the Holiday Christmas Wish, and many more.

#### Reason Nominee Should Be Chosen:

Frankly, you'd be hard-pressed to find a reason not to choose him. Stu Haskell is the epitome of a broadcaster and not only had success himself, but helped find and launch the careers of many other Colorado broadcasters who are still in our state serving our communities today. Stu is a pioneer in Colorado broadcasting, whose fingerprints are all over the state. There cannot be a Hall of Fame without the legendary Mr. Haskell in it.
